# Dendrobium speciosum v. curvicaule "Max ' AM 83 pts.

Four hundred and twenty cupped flowers well arranged and presented on six inflorescences; sepals and petals light yellow, cream-color basally; lip cream-color, lightly spotted purple, bright yellow keel; column and anther cap creamcolor; substance medium; texture matte; fragrance noted.



# Pleurothallopsis inaequalis 'Bryon' HCC 78

Five large, flat flowers and four buds on nine inflorescences blooming at leaf axial; sepals and petals translucent pale yellow; dorsal sepal with three maroon stripes; lateral sepals darker yellow on inferior portion, one maroon stripe; petals slightly porrect, midrib maroon; lip yellow overlaid yellow-orange on proximal four-fifths, three maroon stripes, nectar drops on midrib; side lobes yellow; column pale yellow with maroon blush on distal superior tip, anther cap pale yellow; ovary chartreuse, 0.2cm wide x 0.5cm long; substance good; texture crystalline; species from Colombia; flowers larger than the previous CBR award; ID by SITF on 04/20/2015



# Tolumnia Calypso Queen 'Sundance' CCM 86 pts. Four hundred eighty-nine flowers and 159 buds on 83 inflorescences evenly displayed on a very clean plant

96cm diameter and 38cm height completely overgrowing a 10cm wooden basket; sepals white heavily barred mahogany, lateral sepals fused; petals white barred mahogany proximal one half; lip full, white with slightly frilled margin and small mahogany barred mask under the column, four small yellow keels; winged column and anther cap pale pink; substance medium; texture matte.



# Paphiopetalum Julius 'Hazel' AM 81 pts.

Four well-spaced and nicely presented chartreuse flowers on a 67-cm staked inflorescence; dorsal and synsepal vertically striped mahogany; petals spotted dark mahogany proximal one-half, heavily overlaid maroon distal one-half; pouch front and sides heavily overlaid mahogany, reverse striped dark mahogany; staminode cream-color overlaid mahogany centrally, margins hirsute; substance medium, texture matte.



#### Myoxanthus antennifer 'Karlene' CBR

Twelve flowers and two buds on eight inflorescences; plant growing on 9-cm by 12-cm cork slab with sphagnum moss, longest terete ramicaul 0.2cm wide x 32cm long, covered with five dry tan sheaths spotted maroon, longest linear leaves 0.9cm wide x 16cm long, medium green; sepals and petals translucent chartreuse overlaid with maroon spots and stripes; hirsute petal margins maroon; lip dark maroon, light green central stripe, white hirsute margins; column light green overlaid maroon on distal, superior one-third, two teeth on inferior margin, anther cap light green; substance heavy; texture crystalline; species from

Ecuador; ID by SIFT
