Oeceoclades calcarata

Pronunciation: ee-see-o-CLA-deez cal-CAR-ata

Comprised of 31 species, the genus *Oeceoclades* ranges from the tropical regions of South America, through the West Indies, and into Florida in the western hemisphere. In the eastern hemisphere, the genus is indigenous to tropical Africa, and Madagascar.

Commonly called the Spurred Oeceoclades, *Oeceoclades calcarata* grows as an epiphyte in the moss and lichen forest regions of Madagascar. Growing at elevations of 1000 - 2000 meters (3280 - 6560 feet), *Oeceoclades calcarata* is considered a hot to cool grower.

In cultivation, *Oeceoclades calcarata* plants require intermediate conditions with minimal temperatures of $15^{\circ} - 18^{\circ}$ C (59° - 64° F). After the plant completes its active growth period, minimal watering is required.
